

EDCI 6300: Introduction to Research

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Article Critique Oral Presentation Guidelines

1. Presentation length: 10-15 minutes/per presentation, including question-and-answer period.
2. Content: Each presentation will focus on only one article critique instead of two, at the choice of the presenter(s). The following content needs to be covered:
 - a. Article summary, including background, purpose of the study, study design (methods, participants, etc.), results, and implications.
 - b. Strength of the article in line of the article critique guidelines and AERA standards.
 - c. Weakness of the article in line of the article critique guidelines and AERA standards.
 - d. Your overall ratings and comments on this article.
3. Familiarity: presenter(s) need to be familiar with the presentation content. Reading PowerPoint slides or notes will affect the grades.
4. Presentation Format: either PowerPoint or web-based instruction.
5. Presentation Work Load: If the article critique is group rather than individual work, group members are expected to demonstrate successful collaboration and equal participation in the process.
6. Q & A: Each presenter(s) are expected to take and answer questions from the audience.
7. Please provide a grading rubric with presenter(s) and article information PRIOR TO the presentation.
